Drawing together relevant themes such as Fundamental British Values, Social and Emotional Aspects of Learning (SEAL) and the Global Learning Programme, the school is able to support pupils in their spiritual, moral, social and cultural development, cherishing each pupil as an individual in the knowledge that they are a child of God.
